In the spotlight this month is founding member, Betty Armes, who shares this about her life.

I was born in Louisville, Kentucky, where I grew up and lived until I got married many years later. I went to elementary, junior high (what it was called back then) and high school. I was in the last all girls class to graduate from Atherton High School for girls. At that time our high schools were not co-ed, but became co-ed when I was a senior. All seniors remained in their own schools for that last year. Believe me it was hard to meet guys, but there were coed dances at places like the "Y." I met George, my husband -to-be, at one of those dances and our first date was to see a Frankenstein movie!! Yikes!

I went into nurses training after graduation. George had received a full academic scholarship to Rice University in Houston, Texas, where he studied Electrical Engineering for five years. After graduating from nursing school, we got married in his fourth year at Rice. I moved to Houston where I worked at a hospital just across the street from his school. Mainly, I worked in O.B. and the surgical floor.

George was in the naval ROTC, so he had to serve three years for Uncle Sam after graduation. That tour of duty was in Forest Park, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago. We were so poor but managed like most others back then. I was expecting our first child, Barbara, and didn't work after her birth, as there was no one to help babysit and no money for a sitter, anyway. Our second child, Steve, was born while we were still in Forest Park. George was stationed at the Naval Ordinance Plant and was fortunate to have had a desk job for three years. He always said he owed everything to the Navy for the things he learned that helped in his career.

After three years, he finished his tour and went to work for General Electric in Danville, Illinois. He stayed in the Naval Reserves for three more years which meant going to a meeting once a week and a two week active duty cruise every year. After three years he was offered a job at Ampex Corporationin Redwood City, CA. We were so excited to leave snow and ice in 1963 to come to sunny California. (There were still fruit orchards everywhere.) My life was busy with Little League, soccer, swim meets, football and Girl Scouts, as well as Bible study and other activities at church. In my spare time (which wasn't much) I liked to sew, read and work in our garden. Our third child, David, was born in San Jose where we lived for 45 years. During that time all the children grew up, married and moved away. When George retired, we went on cruises and traveled to many places.

After 58 years of a wonderful marriage, my husband, George, died after a short illness in 2013. I, then, started the long process of selling our house to move closer to our daughter in Concord. Both sons lived in other states by then. With her help and her family's help, I found the duplex or "duet home" where I live now. I joined the Garden Club and Clayton Valley Village after meeting Sonja Wilkin. CVV was just what I needed to meet people who were helping each other to stay in our homes as long as possible. I continue to meet so many wonderful people at my church and wherever I go. It has helped ease the pain of losing my husband and moving away from neighbors, church, friends and our home of all of those memorable years.


