CVV VISIT TO ARF

CVV recently visited the Tony LaRussa's Animal Rescue Foundation (ARF). It was a great tour and we learned a lot about ARF. Here is the story of how it become a reality.

The catalyst for ARF came on May 7, 1990 at a televised baseball game between the Oakland Athletics and the New York Yankees. In the middle of an inning and amidst cheers from spectators, a stray tortoise-shell cat looking for food took a wrong turn and suddenly found herself on the playing field.

Trapped in the enormous Oakland Coliseum and frightened by the roar of the crowd, the frantic cat dashed around the field, desperately leaping at any means of escape and eluding the players and umpires who tried to capture her. Panicked and unable to find a way out, she slinked toward the infield, exhausted from her ordeal. Tony LaRussa, then-manager for the Oakland Athletics, coaxed her gently into the A's dugout where she would spend the rest of the game in safe confines.

Tony and his wife Elaine, a life-long animal advocate, discovered there was not a single no-kill shelter in the East Bay region of the San Francisco Bay Area and that the little cat would likely be euthanized. They took her under their wing and exhausted every lead in hopes of finding a save haven. At last, they were able to place "Evie" (named after Oakland A's team owner, Evie Haas) in a permanent, loving home where she could live out her natural life.

Evie wouldn't be the last "save" of Tony's career. The experience awakened Elaine and Tony to the realization of the desperate circumstances in besieged public animal shelters and the plight of homeless dogs and cats, and inspired them to take action. Less than a year later, they co-founded ARF with the goal of rescuing dogs and cats before they ran out of time at high-kill shelters.



CVV members who were given a tour of the facility were so inspired by the work of ARF that they started a fundraiser among their members and collected \$800. SHARE Meeting May 25, 2019 from 9-11am Pleasant Hill Senior Center



SHARE (Social and Health Agencies Resource Exchange) holds meetings every other month, encourages networking and mingling, followed by a program, and at the end, each attendee gives name and organization. The topic of this month's program was "The Movement to End Gun Violence - Keeping Our Families and Communities Safe." The featured speaker was Candida Brown, MD, Pediatric Neurologist at Diablo Valley Child Neurology, an affiliate of Stanford Health Alliance. She addressed the concerns with the elder community and interaction with their families on the subject. The representative from the "Be SMART" program, Lisa Dell'Ano (pictured above), outlined the steps she and others have taken with a campaign to take action to promote responsible gun ownership and reduce child gun deaths.

The **Speak for Safety** is a campaign to raise awareness of the Gun Violence Restraining Order, a historic, first of its kind tool in California for temporarily removing firearms from loved ones in crisis. Attending this meeting was a good reminder to all about the existence of Villages throughout the country and our local Clayton Valley Village in particular. Building and maintaining relationships with all sectors of our community is an important ongoing goal not only as a resource for our own community but as potential for presentations and sponsorships.



CVV members and volunteers have many interests, hobbies and skills, so we invite you to start an "Interest Circle." It's a great way to meet, share and learn from others in our village who share common interests.
