CVV Expanded Coverage and Trial Membership Option Now Available

Clayton Valley Village is determined to increase its membership. We feel that by offering this trial membership, those who have not felt "the need" to join our Village and/or who feel they have enough support from family/neighbors/friends, will now get to experience the value of our village connections, will make new friends, will enjoy our activities, and will have the opportunity to request services provided by our wonderful volunteers. The Board of Directors has approved the creation of a "Trial Membership" to help those in the community get to know the value of being a CVV Member.

Trial Membership Guidelines

- 1. A 3-month commitment by new member(s) at \$50/month for individuals or \$75/month for a couple paid monthly by credit card.
- 2. A 30-day written notice by email to withdraw from the membership.
- 3. Volunteer services can be requested once the new membership has been approved.

- The CVV **Tech Committee** meets on the third Tuesday of the month and also participates in the HV Users group and handles Database Management.
- The CVV **Communications/Publicity Committee** interfaces with the Tech Committee and handles Website Development, Newsletters, Printed Promotional Material, Calendar Management, Social Network Outreach and Email Notifications. (No regularly scheduled meetings.)
