# Shrimp Boil Family Favorite from Diane Berger



### INGREDIENTS UNITS: US

1/2 CUP OLD BAY SEASONINNG 2 T SALT

- ▶ 4 QUARTS WATER
- ▶ 1(12 OUNCE) CAN BEER 8 MEDIUM RED POTATOES. FOR 8 MINUTES. **CUT IN QUARTERS CUT IN WEDGES CUT IN 2 INCH LENGTHS** THE COB, THAWED (I USE FOR 4 MINUTES. BIRDSEYE LITTLE EARS) 4LBS LARGE SHRIMP, IN SHELLS

#### DIRECTIONS

IN AN 8-QUART STOCK POT, BRING OLD BAY, SALT, WATER AND BEER TO A BOIL. ADD POTATOES AND

ONIONS; COOK OVER HIGH HEAT

ADD SMOKED SAUSAGE: 2 LARGE VIDALIA ONIONS. CONTINUE TO COOK ON HIGH FOR 5 MINUTES.

2LBS SMOKED SAUSAGE. ADD CORN TO POT; CONTINUE TO **BOIL FOR 7 MINUTES.** 

8 EARS FROZEN CORN ON ADD SHRIMP IN SHELLS, COOK

DRAIN COOKIN LIQUID: POUR CONTENTS OF POT INTO SEVERAL LARGE BOWL OR SHALLOW PAILS. SPRINKLE WITH ADDITIONAL OLD BAY.
