President's Message Sue Manning

It's been a sort of taboo subject to talk about how much something costs. When I've gone to seminars where the speaker is telling us about the type of work they do, wanting me to take advantage of what they're offering, they never seem to get around to telling the price. And even if I ask, the answer is usually whispered.

I'd like to bring up the subject of the cost of membership in Clayton Valley Village. Let's say it's a beautiful spring day and you look out the front window to see a geyser spouting from a broken sprinkler head in your lawn. It needs to be fixed pronto. Who do you call? When will they be here? How much will it cost? The usual answers are, respectively, a plumber, tomorrow and \$100-\$150, parts and labor.

That's one. Then, the following month, the surgery follow-up appointment you've had for 3 months with your M.D. is in two days and you're not yet allowed to drive, so you need a ride from your home to the doctor's office and back again. Who you gonna call? A rideshare company? Lyft's one-way fare is \$17.35 plus a little more if you want to give a tip. Roundtrip = double that.

That's two. The monthly cost of CVV membership for a single person is \$50.00; for a couple, it's \$75.00. And the truth of the matter is...something ALWAYS happens! The monthly dues which entitle members to volunteer services make sense; they compute. But remember, it's not only the services that membership in CVV provides. It's the invaluable benefit of connectedness to the community.

Over the past several years Clayton Valley Village has provided lots and lots of social activities for its members. During the current pandemic, our in-person events and gatherings have been curtailed, but we're still getting together electronically: we're "Zooming!" We're keeping in touch and checking in. Your village is here for you.

I remember getting the first GPS system for our car many years ago. It was so amazing to me that I could plug in an address and a woman's voice would tell me which way to turn in order to reach my destination. If I failed to turn where the voice told me to turn, in a nasal, somewhat exasperated manner, the voice would say "RECALCULATING!" Then a new set of directions would spew out of the device.

No one knows how long this pandemic will last, but I personally am grateful for the technology that allows us to recalculate how we stay connected with one another. And, I am grateful to be a member of this caring and loving community.

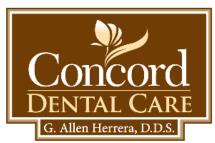
