

about starting one in the Clayton area, when there were none in all of Contra Costa County. She began by contacting Dr. Andy Scharlach, a professor at UC Berkeley and a guru of the Village Movement. That same year, she appeared before the Clayton City Council to introduce the Village concept and build interest in establishing one in the city.

Sonja traveled to her alma mater, Cornell University, and gave a presentation on villages to an alumni forum that summer. She then went to Boston to visit the original Village, Beacon Hill, and to interview one of its founders. Back in Clayton, she continued talking up villages to friends and family.

Coincidentally, in April of 2013, Maria Xiaris saw a PBS program on villages, and was immediately hooked on the concept. Maria spent the next six months researching and contacting long-established villages around the country through the internet-based Village-to-Village Network. She, too, spoke before the Clayton City Council. Her enthusiasm drew a half dozen neighbors to the October 2014 meeting, where the group decided to start a village in the Clayton-Concord area. The group named itself the Clayton Village Initiative.

The word spread, and at the next CVI meeting, Sonja Wilkin appeared, bearing a binder stuffed with material on villages. These two õearly adoptersö joined forces, and along with the dozen other members of the committee, got the ball rolling. Maria served as the first president of what is now CVV, and Sonja is the current CVV president. Clayton Valley Village is now a 501(c)(3) organization, set to open on May 1, 2017. A project five years in the making.
