Representatives from Bay-Area Villages spent a day in the Capitol spreading the word about Villages and their positive impact on communities.

On May 18, representatives from Bay-Area Villages walked the halls of the Capitol visiting 20 legislators and staff, sharing information about the value of Villages as a piece of the Long-Term Care continuum. We were acknowledged from the floor of the Assembly by Assemblymember Chiu (center, below), and introduced on the Senate Floor by Senator Scott Wiener. For the majority of legislators, this was the first time they have heard of Villages and the work we do. ó from NextVillageSF



Chiu met with the group to give guidance on the legislative process, and suggestions for how to work effectively to secure funding. His suggestions included:

- Reach out to the State Aging Department and ask them to include funding in their budget proposal.
- Advocate with candidates that are running for Governor in 2018: Villiarogosa (LA), Garcetti (LA), Delaine Eastin (Davis); Steve Westley (Silicon Valley); Tom Steyer (Silicon Valley); Falconer (San Diego); Newsom (Marin); Hadley (Orange County); John Chang (Orange County), as well as legislators who are running for office, or up for re-election.
- Build broad support in both chambers by doing outreach to key legislators. These include chairs of committees and subcommittees who oversee policy and funding issues.

Attendees felt that they had learned a lot from being in the building and were impressed with how easy it was to meet with both elected officials and their staff. It was clear that elected officials at the state level need to hear from us about the benefits of having a Village in their district.




