#### **Details, Details**

In order for our members and volunteers to be fully covered by insurance, members need to identify all proposed activities when submitting their service requests. An example of multiple requests might be: the outbound trip to Walnut Creek for an MRI; stop at Costco to shop; drop off at Concord hairdresser.

Not only does this safeguard CVV volunteers from an insurance standpoint, it enables our schedulers to efficiently leverage resources (i.e. where one volunteer might collect and drive the member to the MRI, another volunteer might be scheduled to retrieve them hours later).

#### You Asked, We Listened

To meet the needs of our members, CVV has instituted a monthly payment program for member renewals by credit card, as an option to the standard, annual renewal lump sum payment. If you are currently a member and would like to renew your membership with monthly installments, please fill out the form that you will be receiving in the mail this week and return it before May 1st.

talked with members she could feel their passion, support and desire to make a difference for the people they serve. All the attendees learned quite a lot from this very enlightening talk!




